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COOKHAM SOCIETY AND SAVE POUNDFIELD JOIN FORCES TO SAVE THE PONY FIELD

The Cookham Society and the Save Poundfield group have teamed up to fight to protect the last green space next to the Nursery School. The villagers call it "The Pony Field". It is part of "Poundfield". From the edge of the field you can look across to Roman Lea and beyond to the horizon in the direction of Winter Hill. This unspoilt field gives Cookham its rural feel



and is a last refuge for wildlife between the busy, bustling villages. The two groups are doing all they can to fight the threat from Oakford homes. The developer has put in an application to build new houses and parking on the field. If the developer wins, the view will be gone, the wildlife will be gone, and this most cherished green space will be gone forever. We must save it and the character of Cookham for future generations.

The Cookham Society has put its objections to the Planning Department in the strongest possible terms. You too can add weight to the case by writing in person to the Planning Department and expressing your opposition to the loss of this precious green oasis.

POUNDFIELD UNDER PRESSURE

Poundfield has been the subject of planning applications for housing development for over 50 years and opposed by the people of Cookham. A full development was proposed in 1987, vigorously opposed by the1989 campaign by villagers and finally rejected in a 1991 public enquiry by Michael Heseltine, the then Secretary of State. Whilst

Poundfield is now in the Cookham Conservation Area this does not entirely prohibit development. On 23rd February 2016 Councillors of the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead ("RBWM") voted unanimously to support the designation of Poundfield in Cookham as "Local Green Space" in response to the petition from the Cookham Society (who collected well over 1,000 signatures). It is intended that this would protect Poundfield from housing development - consultation is required and this takes place through 2016.



However developer "Oakford Homes" wishes to build houses on the "Pony Field", the smallest of the Poundfield fields, which is next to the Nursery School. On 9th May 2016 they submitted a planning application (see article Cookham and Save Poundfield join forces).

In addition, on 24th February 2016 Berkeley Homes held an exhibition for proposed development of 31 houses on Poundfield, which would result in building on all the other fields comprising "Poundfield". A Planning Application is expected in June 2016. Poundfield is one of the defining and much-loved green spaces at the heart of Cookham's rural character. It is a traffic-free space for walkers, dogs, cyclists and horse riders to enjoy the countryside. It has Saxon and Roman historical significance and also features in the art of Stanley Spencer, our world-renowned Cookham artist. Finally it is a natural environment sustaining biodiversity close to the heart of the community and an irreplaceable habitat for wildlife.

CHICKEN FARM

A further application has been received to ascertain whether it would be lawful to place a removable chicken shed on the site adjoining Lightlands Lane and Strande Walk. The proposed shed would be 36 metres long and would accommodate up to 3000 chickens. The Society is joining with the Parish Council and residents to object to this application.

The Borough Planning Panel is to decide whether this proposal can be regarded as Permitted Development at its meeting in early June. There are many objections to the proposals, but the present state of planning law, make them very difficult to uphold. Even the combined efforts of many Borough departments may struggle to halt this application and it remains to be seen what the weight of public opinion can do in this situation.

COOKHAM AND CROSSRAIL COOKHAM LEFT OUT IN THE COLD BY CROSSRAIL

No electrification of the line

The inauguration of Crossrail from Maidenhead in 2019 will provide a valuable new train service to the centre of London, Docklands and beyond. The present electrification work on the main line will also provide a faster service from Maidenhead into Paddington on the Great Western Service. But these changes are not all good for Cookham. Currently, our Branch Line is not included in the electrification work. We will be left behind in this modernization programme and will lose the present morning and evening direct services between Cookham and Paddington. The proposal of a two trains per hour service on the Branch Line



throughout the day is a welcome improvement, but it is not adequate compensation for the failure to electrify the line and the ending of the important through services.

We are joining with the Parish Council, the Maidenhead and Marlow Passenger Association in pressing for both electrification of the Branch Line and retention of existing direct through services to Paddington.

The Cookham Society's annual Design Award has been given to Cookham Dean Primary School garden. The garden was a community project designed by two parents, Hannah Wilson and Catherine Downes, and incorporates ideas and features suggested by the children.
